

RESOLUTION REPORT

JULIO COTLER PROGRAMME - EDITION 2024

the Julio Cotler Programme was created in 2024 as part of the commemorative activities for OBREAL's 20th anniversary. This programme pays tribute to Professor Julio Cotler, highlighting his legacy and his commitment to higher education as a transformative tool to combat social inequalities.

Aimed at young academics and emerging professionals, the programme seeks to encourage the participation of unpublished voices in academia, promoting intellectual production on three key themes: Education, Social Inequality and Strengthening Democracy.

Summary of the Program and its Calls

In this first edition, the program included two calls:

- Peru Call, intended exclusively for participants from that country.
- Latin America Call, open to participants from other countries in the region and to OBREAL members.

Both calls received a wide response, consolidating the program as a platform for young researchers. As a result of the process, four outstanding articles were selected (two for each call), whose authors will receive a prize of 2,000 euros and the publication of their papers with open access.





Selection Process

The selection process was designed to ensure transparency and fairness. The following is a detail of the stages carried out:

CLOSING OF CALLS FOR PROPOSALS	The deadline for receipt of abstracts was May 15, 2024.
INITIAL ABSTRACT EVALUATION	 The expert evaluators conducted a preliminary review of the proposals. On June 27, 2024, the Expert Committee recommended a list of candidates to move on to the full paper writing stage.
RECEIPT OF FINAL ARTICLES	The deadline for submitting full papers was September 13, 2024.
FULL ARTICLE EVALUATION	During October 2024, the Expert Committee evaluated in detail the articles received, using criteria such as quality, thematic relevance, originality and contribution to the academic debate.
FINAL EVALUATION COMMITTEE MEETING	On November 6, 2024, the Committee deliberated on the final recommendations, also considering regional diversity and gender parity criteria.





Final Results

After the evaluation process, four articles were selected, standing out both for their academic quality and their relevance in relation to the topics proposed by the program. The authors and titles of the selected articles are listed below:

PERU CALL FOR APPLICATIONS	 "The deinstitutionalizing circle of democracy in Peru: structures of political participation conditioned by rational decisions of power" by Franco RUEDA "Political instability in contemporary Peru. Presidential Survivals and Collapses" by Manuel Ernesto AGUIRRE CAHUA
LATIN AMERICA	 "Progress and setbacks in the quality and access to university in Peru in the last 30 years" by Carlos CUADRA "Migration crisis and border. An analysis of the migrant in the speeches of Biden and Trump" by Genesis Oriana PESERGA
