
What is Erasmus+?

International dimension of Erasmus+ 2021-2027






Budget allocated to Africa (2021-2027) 800 M€





International Credit mobility 2022-2024 Number of mobile students and staff



Potential impact of Erasmus+ projects on African economic and trade integration

Enhance Human Capital for economic growth

- Improving quality of education and skills development for students and Higher education staff
- Developing a skilled work force: qualifications and competencies enhance employability in both local and global markets.
- Promoting entrepreneurial mindset through mobility and knowledge exchange

Facilitate knowledge exchange and innovation

- Promoting knowledge exchange between African and European higher education institutions fosters innovation in education content and teaching methods.
- Focusing on sectors vital to Africa's economic development, such as agriculture, renewable energy, digitalisation and health.

Promote Regional Integration and Cooperation in Africa

- Creating regional networks build stronger relationships between African countries and create shared solutions for economic challenges.
- Building capacity in areas like trade policy, economics, and business, indirectly supporting AfCFTA objectives
- Disseminating qualification recognition practices (i.e. Credit Transfer systems)

Support Trade and Economic Policy Development

- •Increased exposure to European trade policies, regulations, and practices
- •Erasmus+ alumni, equipped with international knowledge and experience, can support African businesses gain better access to international markets.




