Higher education as enabler

In the health sector, Team Europe Initiative on Manufacturing and Access to Vaccines, Medicines and Health Technologies (MAV+):

- One of the components is R&D, higher education and skills
- In Rwanda, for example, while the first mRNA facility was opened in Kigali
 in December 2023, MSc and PhD programmes in biotechnology were also
 set up at the University of Rwanda
