AfIELN Background

Established in 2008 as the African Society of International Economic Law (AfSIEL)

2012 First conference in South Africa and the adoption of the name **African International Economic Law Network** (AfIELN)

Objective: "to serve as a forum for the **research**, **study** and **exchange of ideas** in the field of international economic law in Africa and beyond"

Vision of the founders

To establish African leadership and ownership of a regional network distinct from the newly created SIEL – the global network

 The organisation of conferences and knowledge production & dissemination Creation of an educational network to distribute law books to African law schools

This initiative lost momentum after one year

Why book donations as part of the vision?

To make scholarship on international economic law broadly accessible to scholars, students on the continent

Many African universities are poorly financed

Faculty members, inspiring undergraduate and postgraduate students often lack access to the material they require

Book distribution and address part of the problems without solving them altogether
