

UNIVERSITY OF LAS PALMAS DE GRAN CANARIA

The ULPGC is a young university that this year celebrates its thirty-fifth anniversary, having trained more than 80,000 young people who have joined the professional sector in the Canary Islands and the rest of the world. Located in the province of Las Palmas, it is positioned in the eastern islands of the Canary archipelago, with an academic structure that is distributed in the islands of Gran Canaria, Fuerteventura and Lanzarote. With one of the best climates in the world, and a melting pot of diverse and protected landscapes in more than 40%, all its islands are Biosphere Reserves, displaying a valuable natural and cultural heritage recognized by UNESCO.

In 50 years, the archipelago has become a magnet for 16 million tourists per year. The geostrategic position of the Canary Islands, a hundred kilometers from the African continent, an outermost European region and historically linked to America, makes it a point of intercontinental multicultural confluence favored by infrastructures such as the Port of La Luz, the most important in the mid-Atlantic. At present, the ULPGC has around **19,000 students** studying official undergraduate, master's and doctoral degrees, as well as Master's degrees, University Experts and Special Training Programs. Our institution has more than 1,500 teachers who also carry out an important research activity, supported by 117 research groups, some of which are international references.

The range of studies offered by the ULPGC is wide and covers all branches of knowledge: Arts and Humanities, Sciences, Social and Legal Sciences, Health Sciences and Engineering and Architecture. All official degree courses offered by the ULPGC have a plus of quality and excellence, endorsed by the European Commission through the Erasmus University Charter, which allows students enrolled in any of the degree courses to participate in the Erasmus + Program in more than 250 partner universities for exchanges in Europe. Likewise, the ULPGC has signed collaboration agreements with Spanish universities, within the framework of the SICUE Program, as well as with universities in the United States, Latin America, Canada, Switzerland, South Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Japan and Australia, among others, which also allows it to offer intercontinental mobility. In addition, the ULPGC stands out for offering International Double Degree programs, thanks to the agreements established mainly with universities in the United Kingdom, Germany and France. It also has five UNESCO Chairs, linked to marine studies, local health systems, human rights, sustainable tourism and creative cities.

ERUA. EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES

Since the end of 2023, the ULPGC joined the **European Universities Initiative**, forming part of the ERUA alliance, with

seven other universities coordinated by Paris 8. This is a proposal of great continental academic impact, since only 10% of European universities are part of this ERAMUS+ funded program that aims to shape the European academic future. This allows students who wish to do so to obtain two official degrees accredited in the European Higher Education Area, one from each university. The ULPGC has a Science and Technology Park that promotes the transfer of R+D+i results to the surrounding society and serves as a base for the creation of technology-based companies. The ULPGC offers quality education at public prices and all the services you need for your university studies that will allow you to achieve your goals. For new students, the ULPGC provides, through its Mentoring Program, assistance to its new students. Mentored students have the support of veteran students or mentors, who guide them during the first semester in the incorporation to the university world.

CAMPUS

On the island of **Gran Canaria** is the Tafira Campus, the largest, located on the outskirts of Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, where you can study: Engineering, Architecture, Law, Economics, Business Administration, Tourism, Marine Sciences, Physical Activity and Sport. The Obelisco Campus, located in the center of the city, houses the Humanities, Education and the headquarters of the Teletraining Structure, including Translation and Interpretation, Languages and Litera-

ture, Geography, History, and Education. The San Cristóbal Campus, facing the Avenida Marítima, houses the Health Sciences studies, while the Montaña Cardones Campus, near the town of Arucas, houses the Veterinary Studies. On the island of **Fuerteventura** and **Lanzarote**, nursing studies are offered, and on the latter, with the Cabildo de Lanzarote, tourism studies. In short, a hospitable university located in a paradisiacal place, connected to the world and a place of opportunity to project the talent of its community.

AFRICA

The ULPGC has 35 years of **commitment to the African continent**, which must be consolidated in a project that allows these academic initiatives to be brought together and reinforced in an **International Knowledge Hub in Africa**, which allows the constitution of an international reference center for other academic institutions, that, under the commitment of the ULPGC, allow us to constitute the seed of opportunity through a service infrastructure that contributes to growth and mutual learning through this bridge of international knowledge towards Africa.
